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# Perdido Key Dune Restoration Project

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Perdido Key Dune Restoration Project

**Description:**  
This project restored appropriate dune vegetation to approximately 20 acres of degraded Key, Florida, including habitat used by the federally endangered Perdido Key Beach Moth area that began approximately 2.2 miles east of Perdido Pass at the Alabama/Florida state approximately 6 miles to the east. The improvements consisted of planting appropriate (panic grasses, cord grasses, sea purslane, beach elder) approximately 20-60 feet seaward provide a buffer to the primary dune and enhance dune habitats. In addition, gaps in existing were re-vegetated to provide a continuous dune structure. All plants were grown from seed or North Florida coast to ensure appropriate genetic stocks were used in the project.

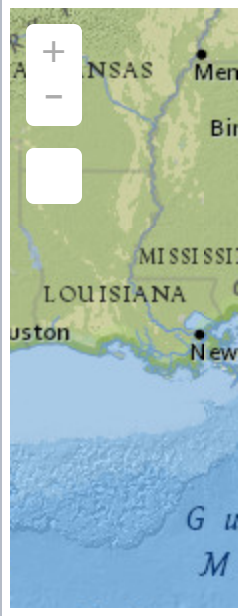
