Description:

This project will apply living shoreline techniques to restore, at a minimum, 2,200 feet of southwestern corner and southern shore of Little Lagoon in Bon Secour National Wildlife coastal Alabama. Restoration will include a combination of evaluating, planning, and ins of plantings of smooth cordgrass (Spartina alterniflora) and black needlerush (Juncus restructures and/or native mussel seeding. Stabilization of the shoreline will also reduce el supports the federally endangered Alabama beach mouse and help create more storm-

shoreline habitats.

Recent Update:

In 2023, plants were installed along the shoreline of Little Lagoon.

Project Modifications:

In 2019, in order to choose the appropriate siting of the living shoreline, a Phase I site assessment was required to comple Preservation Act compliance. The total project cost was revised to incorporate the addition of this site assessment and a Ralabama Trustee Implementation Group (TIG) to fund this assessment. In 2022, the Alabama Trustee Implementation Group extend the cooperative agreement between the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service and Mississippi State University to continue
